The purpose of this seminar is to discuss relevant issues related to the CWC.

Seminar objectives are:

- To provide an overview of the CWC and the OPCW: their current status, tasks, activities and challenges;
- To update on the OPCW activities in the fields of assistance and protection against chemical weapons and toxic industrial chemicals in accordance with Article X of the CWC;
- To inform about the OPCW concept and developments in preparedness for Investigation of Alleged Use and Delivery of Assistance operations in the case of use or threat of use of chemical weapons and toxic industrial chemicals;
- To emphasize the importance of capacity building in the field of protection against a possible use of chemical weapons and toxic industrial chemicals, through projects on national and regional levels;
- To inform about the assistance offered by the countries in the region under Article X of the CWC, as well as about their preparedness, reaction time, and provision of logistic support;
- To analyse the statistics of submission of annual information on national protection programmes in accordance with paragraph 4, Article X of the CWC by the countries of the sub-region; problems and developments in this area;
- To present information on the third OPCW delivery of assistance exercise ASSISTEX 3, held in Tunisia in October 2010: information about the event and the analysis of lessons learned;
- To provide an update on issues related to the OPCW verification activities;
- To present information on the OPCW Technical Secretariat inspections: aims, procedures and challenges;
- To execute training with table exercises on routine inspection procedures; to clarify differences between regular inspection procedures, delivery of assistance operations and investigation of alleged use.
