Protection of Human Rights and fundamental freedoms is globally based on UN Charter (1945) and UN Resolution 217 with the UN Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948). Gender aspects of woman are based on UN Security Council Resolutions 1325 and 1820, European Convention on Human Rights (Council of Europe 1950) and other regional instruments in Europe. Implementation of the Human Rights Protection on national level is still an important political obligation, not only for the SEE countries, but for the World as a whole. How to promote equal opportunity for women and men is still a big challenge for independent state institutions to work together towards the elimination of discrimination. RACVIAC's SSR programme for the mid term period has an ambition to cover the protection of human rights, too.

The Round table Gender and SSR is the first one in a series of events of such a kind.

Main objectives of the Seminar are:

- a)** to introduce participants of the seminar the historical and legal background of the phenomenon of the human rights and fundamental freedoms protection,
- b)** to provide clarification of the terms Gender and Security Sector Reform itself,
- c)** to acquaint participants with practical examples of successful multinational projects/cases of implementation of gender and SSR concept in institutions of States (Parliament, Ministries of Defence, Interior, Justice and Police) and NGO's, too.

Participants are invited to:

- a)** present and share information on national developments in the national plans and projects implementing human rights protection and promote gender issue in SSR;
- b)** present examples and opportunities for human rights protection focusing on gender issue.

The ambition of the Round table is also to inform briefly participants with the experiences of Ombudsman persons institutions and with national, European and international Human Rights Protection systems.
