The purpose of the conference is to encourage further development of regional cooperation on Search and Rescue (SAR) issues and to promote enhancement of the existing national SAR structures through the exchange of information and sharing of available training opportunities and relevant SAR exercises.

- a) To explore national points of views on SAR in order to launch a comprehensive regional SAR development process/project;
- b) To identify and list the potential needs of the countries (e.g. education and exercise);
- c) To present the Baltic Sea area, as an illustrative example of a SAR cooperation model;
- d) To encourage and develop possible regional and national cross border cooperation on SAR development through operational SAR working groups;
- e) To initiate the establishment of a regional search and rescue functional network in SEE with the aim to enhance mutual assistance among search and rescue services and optimize the use of search and rescue resources in emergency situations;
- f) To present national SAR statuses, identification of the functional RCC structure and exchange of lesson learned and best practices.
